Early Childhood Screening is a quick and simple check of how your child is growing and developing.

Between the ages of 3 and 4, screening can detect possible health or learning concerns, so that children can get help before they start school.

Should I wait until my child is in kindergarten?

No, earlier is better! Waiting until a child is in school may be waiting too long. If your child is between the ages of 3 and 4, call your school district to ask about Early Childhood Screening*.

*A health and developmental Screening from Head Start, Child and Teen Checkups or your health care provider may meet the school requirements.



All of the information from your child's Early Childhood Screening is important to his/her future school success. After the screening, you will know how your child is growing, developing and learning.

In order for your child to start kindergarten in any Minnesota public school, you will need to provide your child's Early Childhood Screening Summary Form and Immunization Record.

At your child's screening, a trained professional will check**

- **☆Vision**
- **Hearing**
- ☆ Height & Weight
- **☆Immunization (shots) status**
- **☆Large & Small Muscles**
- ★Thinking, Language, & Communication Skills
- **★**Social & Emotional Development
- ** Some school districts may offer other screening components, including dental and nutrition reviews.


